## Health Camp in Dairy Intensive Zones:

---

Orissa is an agriculture state, where livelihoods depend heavily on livestock. The state has sizeable number of livestock. As the state puts emphasis on livestock for enhancement of rural livelihoods, it is planned to conduct an Animal Health Camp at Panchayat level to ensure veterinary services at the doorstep of farmers.

The response of Dairy farmers to Frozen Semen Artificial Insemination (FSAI) in intensive zone is very high. However, with the increase in AI activity there is an increased emergence of some of its associated problems. Repeat breeding in dairy cattle is one of the major problems. Therefore, it is proposed to organize two infertility treatment camps in each GP of intensive zone. There are about 1700 GPs which are coming under intensive zone of the State.

Moreover, in order to attract the farmers towards this activity, an advanced reproductive technology – Controlled Breeding can be implemented in certain areas with specific objective of timely insemination and thereby expecting a reasonable success i.e. calf born. In elite coastal districts the same can be implemented to make farmers aware on fertility management practices. It is proposed to take-up controlled breeding at 3 locations in a Block with 40 to 50 cyclic cows per location per year.

The basic objective of conducting the camp is to gain an understanding of the general livestock health status; management practices and prevalent diseases/problems in the area so that livestock related interventions could be taken up systematically.

The camps will be organized by local veterinary assistant surgeon and their staff. Outside experts will be invited as per the need. Dairy Cattle, Buffalo will be treated for different diseases/problems. The calves born out of AI will be dewormed and general awareness programme will be taken for raising awareness level of livestock owners for better animal health management practices

Free veterinary camps would be conducted by the Department of Animal Husbandry in the 1700 dairy intensive Gram panchayats of the state, to enable farmers and poor people to get treatment for their dairy cattle and buffalo. Anestrous & Repeat Breeding animals of animal owners will get a scope to treat scientifically which will result in to increased in milk production.
